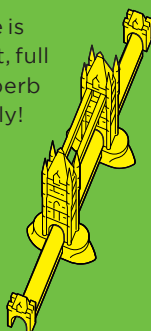
LEADENHALL MARKET

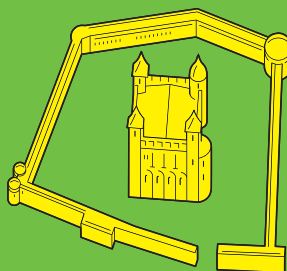
